Course objective:

The objective of this course is for the student to become familiar with and understand the field of human development within a biological, cognitive, and socio-emotional framework. Our goal is to use theory, research and observation to deepen our understanding and awareness of ongoing development in all stages of life from conception to death.

Exams:

There are a total of **four exams** (3 non-cumulative interim exams and 1 **cumulative final exam**) consisting of multiple choice, true/false, matching and fill-in-the-blank questions. You may drop your lowest grade on any one of the **first 3 interim** exams. **The final cannot be dropped.** The two highest interim grades will then each count for 30% of your grade. The final will count for 40%.

Missed exams:

There are <u>NO make-ups</u> for a missed exam. Because the lowest exam grade is dropped, if you are late or absent and miss an exam that will be the one that is automatically dropped (not including the final). No exceptions. If you know ahead of time that you have to miss more than one exam drop the class now. The final can NOT be made up at another time.

Attendance & Course Content: It is strongly recommended that you attend class. Not all of the material covered in class comes from the textbook, and not all of the material in the textbook will be covered in class. Any material covered *in class* will be the basis of exams. I will post outlines of each chapter on Blackboard before each class and encourage you to print and bring these outlines to class with you. Remember, these are OUTLINES not complete notes. You are expected to complete the notes yourself by attending class. If you miss class, please use the posted outlines as a guide and ask your fellow classmates for notes and/or read your textbook before coming to me. I will be happy to meet with you to discuss anything after you do this, however *I will not send you notes*.
