Each time we complete 3 chapters, there will be a quiz on them. APPROXIMATE dates of these quizzes: June 16; June 30; July 14; & July 23. We will, however, allow some flexibility on these dates as pacing suggests. You will be responsible on these quizzes for all textbook AND lecture material. Bring your own scantron and #2 pencils for each quiz. Once I have returned scantrons, quiz grades cannot be altered. If you miss any classes, please consult fellow students for lecture material (do not call me).

Extra credit opportunities: up to 5 extra points added to the final average on your quizzes, as follows: research participation, 1 point; 1 point each on up to 4 book reports. To be acceptable, each book report must be typed, double-spaced, 2 full pages in length, with 1-inch margins. While it is not required, it would be prudent to have books approved by your teacher.

Thus, your grade for the course will consist of the average of your quiz grades, plus whatever extra credit you have earned.
